

May Meeting Minutes

Linda welcomed members and guests and included a reading of the guild's mission statement.

She continued with congratulations to those celebrating May birthdays and thanked Pam Miller, Kathy Helner and Mary Dellenbach for providing this month's delicious refreshments.

April's minutes were read with corrections as follows: The newsletter should have read "April Meeting Minutes", not March; Tresa Keys corrected the number of Quilts of Valor donated, which should be 5 to 6 quilts in progress, not yet donated. Marg Jeakle made a motion to accept the minutes as corrected, seconded by Jessica Haslock.

A motion to accept the March and April Treasurer's Report was submitted by Laurel Owen and seconded by Margaret Nemec.

Linda reminded members to please read the newsletter for updates and changes. She also commented on the following board meeting results: The proposed UFO project will be placed under the auspices of the program committee; show-and-tell after the meeting will be organized differently to be more efficient; the next board meeting possibly may be changed to May 22nd.

Ken Thompson encouraged members to visit the National Quilt Museum in Paducah. He also announced that CS Sewing in Traverse City will be demonstrating the HandiQuilter the first week in June.

The following new members were welcomed to the guild: Barbara Gutskey and returning member Helen Truchan.

Jan Gray reminded members that the August 14th non-meeting (2nd Thursday) will be the bi-annual quilt walk, hosted by several members in the Cheboygan/Indian River area. She asked for volunteers to help as greeters, docents, providing booties, etc. A meeting will be held on Thursday, May 15th at 10:00 to discuss further plans.

Lois Furness, Program Chair, discussed upcoming programs and workshops, including the October lecture and workshop with Laura Wasilowski, the September Tea with Darla Parks and the June Mystery Guest, Cheri Candy Clum.

Lois also reminded members of the June mini-workshops that will be held beginning at 3:00 p.m. before the June 8th meeting. Please read your April Newsletter for particulars. More mini-workshops will be held in November.

Jeanette Kling and Pat Shannon are chairing the "Christmas in July" picnic, to be held at the Mackinaw Trail Winery and catered by Roast & Toast. Please bring a wrapped "white elephant" gift for exchange. The cost for the luncheon is \$10, and an additional \$5 will provide members with winetasting and a tour of the wintery. The July 10th luncheon begins at 11:30 a.m.

Lois mentioned that only 10 people had signed up for the Friday workshop with guest speaker Laurie Ceesay and that it was not too late to sign up. As an incentive, she commented that there was no homework, only fabric, required!

Judy Goldsmith, Peds Quilt Chair, stated that more quilts were needed for the hospital.

Pat Nolan, Placemats Chair, also asked the members to keep contributing.

Stephanie Smith announced the winners of the drawing: Sandy Hill won a JoAnn's gift card and Penny Harrington won a pattern donated by our guest speaker, Laurie Ceesay.

Phyllis Hosier, Program Committee, distributed a questionnaire for suggestions from members for preference of types of workshops, dollar amount members would be willing to pay for a class and length of classes.

Shelley Stallard announced that a "Dear Jane" group meeting will be held on September 4, 2014 at the Charlevoix Public Library. The cost will be \$10 to cover rental expense. She also informed members that her quilt was included in the 2015 Quilt Art Engagement Calendar. Congratulations, Shelley!


Quilt Walk Committee
