President Tresa Keys brought the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. and opened with "An Irish Blessing." Kay Geuder introduced five guests of various members. Tresa recognized the March birthday celebrants. The secretary's minutes for February were approved as published in the newsletter with a motion by Liz Bitterman, seconded by Shelley Stallard.

Tresa thanked Sue Thompson for sending cards to Diane Simancek (surgery), Mary Nelson (husband had a stroke), Sue Stackhouse (sympathy) and Marian Henthorne (sister passed away). She also thanked Helene Kleymeer, Secretary, for "wearing two hats" in assisting Jan Gray (returning April 1) with the newsletter distribution and dissemination of information to members about the 7&4 News profile, focusing on Quilts of Valor National Sew Day. The news team interviewed Tresa, while members Lois Hart, Renee Prevo, Nettie Hosler and Peggy Spang assisted, despite blizzard conditions that day. On Quilts of Valor National Sew Day, February 4, 2017, over 2,000 quilts were made nationally.

The Quilts of Valor group has completed and delivered 125 quilts to-date. Tresa thanked the "Charlevoix Group" and the Dyles for providing the evening's refreshments.

Judith Ivan volunteered to chair the September Tea. Kathleen Andrews will present a trunk show of "Kwilt Illusions". Judith is requesting assistance from members, as indicated on the signup sheet. Also, additional help is needed to clean up after the monthly meetings.

The "freebie" table has been re-established with the following criteria: Items must be quilt-related (no home dec, sewing or knitting) and you must take home whatever has not been taken.

A publicity chair is still needed.

Tresa has 10 free tickets available to members for the Quilt Festival in Chicago from April 6th through 8th.

Servant Hearts has been added as the fifth charity the Guild supports. They will accept most any fabrics for quilt- and blanket-making. The group meets on the last Thursday of the month and the home of Johanna Kutcher.

Just a reminder: Pediatric quilts need to be age-appropriate.

Hospice: 87 quilts have been given to families of cancer victims. The quilt-making group meets at Hiland House every Wednesday from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

Programs:

There will be no program tonight, since Peggy Spang (bag-making) is ill. The program will be rescheduled.

April: Sue Ann Wiltse, of Harbor Springs, will provide a trunk show of her award-winning quilts. She has won awards at AQS in Lancaster, as well as the Quilt Show in Petoskey, for her quilt "American Pie". Her quilt also was selected for the AQS calendar for next year. She has over 25 quilts in her trunk show.

May: Mickey Depre will be the guest and will provide a trunk show and teach a class in a portable, hand-pieced, Castle Wall quilt block. The class is \$30 (\$40 after tonight) and a required kit will be \$25. A supply list is in the newsletter.

June: The Quilt Show is the focus of the month. Shelley responded to various questions regarding appraisals and is distributing a signup sheet for same. Appraisal fees are \$50 written and \$30 verbal. A written appraisal is necessary for insurance purposes.

July Picnic: Lavender Farms. More details are coming.

August: Bobbie Brooks, of Backstreet Quilts will provide a trunk show and a class, making a wool work needle book and tote.

September Tea: Kathleen Andrew will introduce her business, KwiltArt, which focuses on quilt illusions and Celtic designs. She will teach classes on Friday and Saturday, September 15 and 16.

October: Karen Kay Buckley will be the featured speaker. She will offer classes on October 13 and 14.

November: Julie and John Dyle will present doll quilts through the decades.

December: the holiday party will be held on December 14th.

Tresa conducted a brief poll of members regarding their preference for traditional, art, or mixed quilt techniques.

The 2017 budget was discussed at the February Guild board meeting. To synopsise, the cost to bring in teachers for 2017 is \$3,200. Other expenses include administrative expenses, charity support, donation/rent to the Friendship Center, newsletter costs, insurance, membership books and correspondence. The total of all expenses is \$7,055. The general fund shows a balance of \$4,795, which does not reflect the \$2,000 Quilt Show anticipated proceeds for 2017 (additional \$2,000 is held in reserve for the 2018 budget). Thus, available funds are \$6,795, reflecting a shortfall of \$265. Members were encouraged to share fundraising thoughts. Suggested were auctions at the Bergmann Center or Lake Associations on the Quilt Show off-year.

The March Treasurer's Report and Budget will be provided in April.

Sandy Rogers suggested the Log House in Michaywe as a retreat site for 2018. Food is prepared onsite and cost is very reasonable.

Shelley Stallard reviewed the Quilt Show Registration form, found in the newsletter. She also answered questions regarding quilt categories.

Entries must acknowledge the creator of a pattern/design, even if some changes have been made. No acknowledgment is necessary if the pattern is in the public domain.

May 1st is the deadline to submit pictures of a quilt entry. Color needs to be accurate!

The raffle tickets were printed, cut and collated for free by McLaren Hospital. Although 3,000 were distributed, 1,000 more are needed. Ticket proceeds are due by the June meeting. Thirteen items have been completed for the raffle, but 100 or more are needed. Guild members vote on raffle items.

The Friendship Star Blocks, which will be sewn into a quilt to be auctioned, are due before next month.

As always, volunteers are needed for many positions. Sign-up sheets will be distributed next month.

The raffle was won by Evelyn Howell.

The business meeting was adjourned at 7:30 p.m.

Show and Tell followed the meeting, as well as the "String Quilt Reveal", in which members showed the quilts they created in the string quilt class held in November. Kite-shaped templates are available from Shelley for \$10.

Board Meeting Notice

On Thurs. March 16, 2017 the LTBQG Board unanimously voted to recommend to the membership an increase in our dues from \$30 to \$40, annually, starting Sept. 2017. This decision was made after much thoughtful discussion and careful consideration of our tight budget. Dues have been static for over ten years.

Where else can you find great programming; take advantage of continuing education classes, in a myriad of quilting subjects; find comrades of a like mind who speak "quilting" language and be a special part of a very generous group of quilters who give back to the community?

As I mentioned at the March meeting, our present dues cover only \$30. Of the guild's cost of \$50 per person cost per year.

Per the LTBQG By-Laws; Article III, Section IV, (last two sentences).

"A proposed change in the amount of dues shall be published in the newsletter prior to the scheduled vote and voted on no later than the NOVEMBER meeting. The change shall carry by a two thirds majority of members present" We propose to change the month to JULY. We will vote to change the dues from \$30 to \$40, annually. This notice will be announced at the April and May meetings and voted on June 8, 2017.

STUDENTS WILL NEED TO BRING:

Thimble-If you don't have one I will have a possible solution for you

Scissors for fabric cutting-will want a blade at least 5-6" in length

Scissors for thread snipping-short blade

1. You must complete ALL 3 pages of the registration for EACH quilt you enter. Please Print
2. We need TWO pictures of your quilt. Make sure the color is correct, one photo is used for planning the show layout.
3. Write your name and size of quilt on the back of the photo
4. The photos should be identical.
5. If your quilt isn't finished yet, send the registration/photos anyway.
6. It is very important that we recognize any designer and their pattern or book that was used in your quilt. Even if your quilt was inspired by another designer, please give them credit for their work. (see March newsletter for more info on this)
7. All registrations must be postmarked by May 1st.
8. There is a list of Category Definitions to help you decide on your category. If you are unsure of your category, or if you have any questions, please contact Judy Ettema or Shelley Stallard.

We have received some registrations for the show that are not completely filled out.

Important things are missing, or page 2 is only filled out in one section.

- Thursday, June 15th: Hanging, boutique, challenge, special exhibits, vendor set up & set up of everything else

2017 Quilt Show Category Definitions

Bed Quilt: Intended for use on any bed

Wall Quilt: Intended for use on a wall

Domestic Machine: The quilt is moved by hand under a home sewing machine to do the quilting.

Long Arm Machine: Track mounted sewing machine is moved over the surface of the quilt to do the quilting.

Pieced: Piecing PREDOMINATES over other techniques in amount and effect

Appliqued: Applique PREDOMINATES over the other techniques in amount and effect

Mixed Technique: A quilt in which an equal amount of multiple techniques is used to develop the design

Other Quilt: A quilt in which a special technique is used to develop the top, such as whole cloth, surface design, crazy quilt, yo-yo quilts, cathedral window, machine embroidery, etc.

Group Quilt: A quilt in which more than 3 persons are involved in its construction or finishing in any way

Art Quilt: Your original design reflecting innovative construction and design techniques, themes or subject matter and/or materials. No commercial patterns or copies of previous works. Quilts must be made of fabric, have three layers and include quilt stitching through all layers. A quilt based on traditional patterns and designs should be entered in another category. Due to space limitations, only Art Quilts that can be hung in the traditional manner will be accepted.

Miniature Quilt: Maximum size of 24 inches by 24 inches. All aspects of the quilt are reduced in scale.

Wearable Items and Accessories: Any item intended for clothing or clothing accessory.

Multi-Generational Quilt: Vintage blocks are used in the quilt. The vintage blocks must be used in an innovative way to create a new quilt top. No antique tops or blocks with only simple sashing and borders will be accepted. This category is intended for the blocks to be the inspiration for a new and exciting quilt.

2017 Challenge Raffle

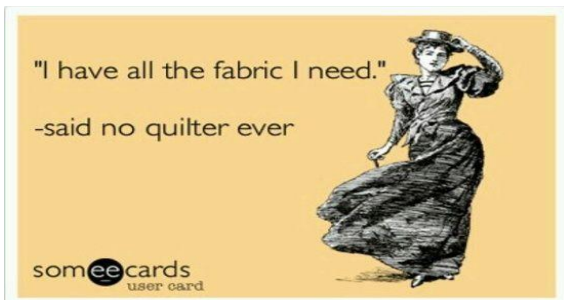
Each show year we sell "Challenge Fabric" for our members to use on a raffle item for our show. This is a major fund raiser for the show, and our guests love the fact that they have over 50 chances to win something in our raffle. **You can make anything for the raffle. The only rule is that at least one of the "Challenge Fabrics" must be visible in your item. It is super fun to see what everyone comes up with.** Linda Schofield will bring in the collected items at each meeting, so we can see what clever things your fellow members are making. It doesn't have to take a lot of time to help. .

Raffle Tickets: Yes, you are required to sell raffle tickets. We all benefit from this major fund raiser, so we are all required to help. McLaren Northern Michigan Hospital has graciously donated ALL of the expense and time of printing, cutting and stapling the tickets. This insures a total profit for us, so let's sell all those tickets!! Linda will have an envelope for each member. Tickets are only \$1.00 each, so they are an easy sell. Once you have explained to people that there are over 50 items up for auction, the tickets are easy to sell. Most guilds only have one quilt to raffle! We are AWESOME!!! If you have any questions or issues, please speak to Linda Schofield.

Boutique

Get a jump on having your items for the boutique organized. Stop and see me at the guild meeting. I will have an inventory sheet for you to pick up, and samples of how tags should look. Each of your items needs to be inventoried and tagged. Tags include last name, inventory number on one side, and price on the other. I suggest that you keep pricing in \$\$ increments. It is easier for us to deal with the change needed if you don't price things with .25, .50 or .75 increments.
